#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Select a group facilitator

- 5. Respond to the question in the form of bullet points and a brief narrative
- 6. Identify an area of weakness relative to the research question and propose an improvement plan
- 7. Upload the narrative, improvement plan, and bullet points in a Shared Drive and assign a group representative to present the work

#### Some notes to consider in a group work

- 1. When responding to the research question, be mindful of its relevance and alignment with the Standard
- 2. This is a group discourse, so all members should be heard. During discussions, responses should be evidence-based. Opinions are respected but facts (or evidence) are more important.
- 3. The narrative should be clear, opinion-free, and evidence-based.
