

Graduation Honors

Graduation honors at Eastern International College (EIC) recognize academic excellence achieved by students throughout their undergraduate coursework. These honors are annotated on students' official transcripts and diplomas, highlighting their achievements. Honors are determined based on cumulative GPA, calculated to the nearest hundredth (0.01) without rounding up. Only credits earned at EIC are considered in GPA calculations. Students must also meet specific academic and departmental requirements to qualify, including completing externship, clinical, or departmental obligations; maintaining no failed or incomplete grades; and completing a minimum of 60% of the total coursework (50% for the online completion programs) at EIC.

Latin Honors for Bachelor's Degree.

- Summa Cum Laude: Awarded for a cumulative GPA of 3.90–4.00.
- Magna Cum Laude: Awarded for a cumulative GPA of 3.70–3.89.
- Cum Laude: Awarded for a cumulative GPA of 3.50–3.69.

Graduation Honors for Associate's and Completion Degrees

- With the Highest Distinction: Awarded for a cumulative GPA of 3.90–4.00.
- With High Distinction: Awarded for a cumulative GPA of 3.70–3.89.
- With Distinction: Awarded for a cumulative GPA of 3.50–3.69.
