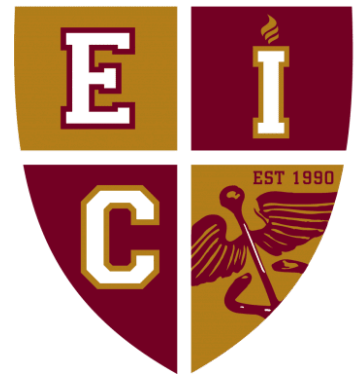

NURSING DEPT ACEN ACCREDITATION UPDATE!

8 YEARS OF CONTINUING ACCREDITATION WITHOUT ANY CONDITIONS UNTIL 2031

The Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program has achieved a significant milestone, proudly maintaining its programmatic accreditation through the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).

On September 26, 2025, the Nursing Department successfully passed its recent ACEN review. The department was granted a full eight years of continuing accreditation without any conditions, extending this prestigious recognition until 2031.

This outcome is a testament to the quality of the faculty, the comprehensive curriculum, and the department's commitment to excellence in nursing education. ACEN accreditation signifies that the ADN program meets rigorous national standards designed to prepare competent and compassionate nurses for the healthcare field.

DMS RESOURCE: NAVIGATING THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Getting certified by the American Registry for Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ARDMS) involves a clear, step-by-step application process:

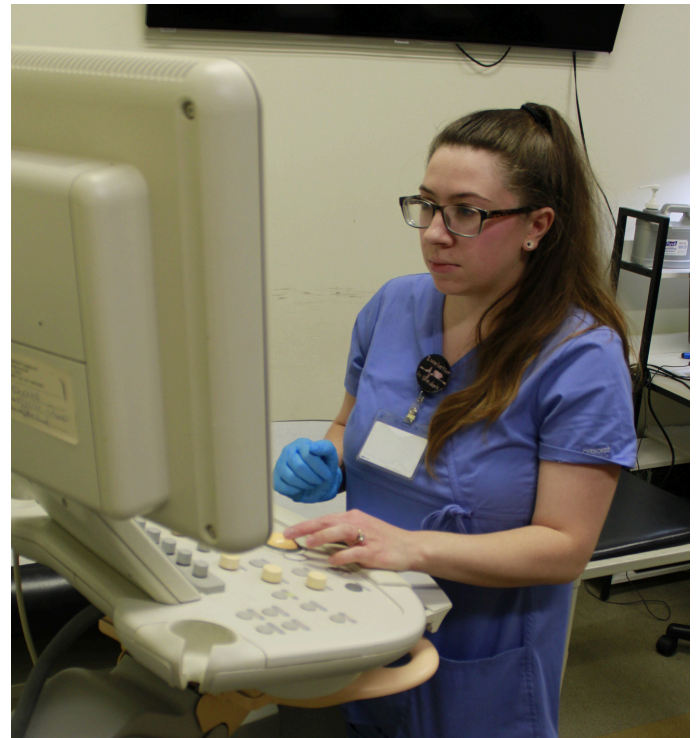
- **Meet Prerequisites:** Carefully review the detailed prerequisites for your desired credential, as you must select a specific pathway (combining education and clinical experience) when you apply. You can use the [Prerequisite Prep Tool](#) for guidance.
- **Apply Online:** Log in to MY ARDMS and select Apply Online. Complete the form, submit payment, and formally attest to reading and agreeing to the [ARDMS Application Agreement](#) and [Compliance Policies](#).
- **Submit Documentation:** Gather all necessary supporting documents (e.g., transcripts, clinical letters) and upload them to your account under the “My Resources” tab.
- **Receive Your ECL:** Once approved, you will receive an Examination Confirmation Letter (ECL) via email. This letter confirms your eligibility and the testing window, allowing you to [schedule your examination](#) with Pearson VUE.



DMS REMEDIATION: A LOOK INTO OUR SCANNING LABS!

Every Wednesday from 5 to 8 p.m., Ultrasound Instructor Faiza Imtiaz, RDMS, CAB, OB/GYN, RVT, VT, conducts DMS Remediation sessions. These sessions provide students and alumni with a crucial opportunity to refine their ultrasound scanning skills.

Remediation hours are essential for students to stay sharp, boost their confidence, and develop the practical skills necessary for success in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography field. Please complete the requirements on the Castle Branch website for your Spring 2026 registration. You must finalize the Background Check and Drug Testing sections to ensure compliance and safety during your clinical training. Here are the instructions for Castle Branch Order Placement:

1) To create an account, go to login.castlebranch.com. Click 'Create Account' and follow the prompts to enter your personal information.

2) After creating your account, click 'Place Order' at the top of your dashboard. You will be prompted to enter the following package code specific to your organization:

Package Code For NJ residents:

EB19bgdt : Background Check - Drug Test \$68.00

EB19im : Compliance Tracker \$29.99

"Shortly after graduating from EIC's Diagnostic Medical Sonography program and completing my externship, I was fortunate enough to be hired at my externship site as a cardiovascular technician. During that time, I improved my scanning skills, learned from experienced professionals, and gained confidence in my practical abilities. My path had challenges: I initially aimed for the echo registry and was not successful in my first few attempts. It was tough not to compare myself to classmates who already passed their board exams. Those moments taught me patience, resilience, and the importance of focusing on my own journey. After moments of feeling defeated and unsure of how to move forward, I realized that giving up was not an option. This time around, I chose to change course and embrace my interest in vascular sonography by pursuing it as my specialty. After months of rigorous studying, I successfully earned my ARDMS credential. Now that I am a registered vascular technologist, the opportunities ahead of me feel endless, and I am enthusiastic about what this new chapter holds. A piece of advice I'd like to give to current and future students is this: perseverance is key. You might not get it right the first time, but you must keep pushing forward. Every setback is simply a part of the journey. And always remember, do not be afraid to take smart risks and explore different areas within the field, as this career is full of opportunities and growth."

This initiative aims to welcome more employer partners to engage with students.

Hello, my name is Emily Mercado, MLS, C.A.G.S., M.Ed. I'm the librarian at EIC! I've been a school librarian for 20 years, mainly at K-12 schools in New England, New York City, and New Jersey. A big part of my job as a librarian is helping students with their research, including proper citations, the research process, and navigating the print and digital resources we have here in the library. I also work collaboratively with the professors at EIC to provide instruction in research related to individual courses in each of our academic programs. I teach a weekly Information Literacy course (on Friday afternoons) in collaboration with the ENG 101 professor, where we cover all aspects of research, from beginning to end. I also offer help in navigating our databases and online resources, editing your papers (I do NOT edit for content, but rather only to check for proper citations and setup), and helping you format a quality research question.

If you would like individual help, you are welcome to stop by the library at any time. I'm available in the library Monday to Thursday from 9:00 AM- 6:00 PM, and Fridays from 9:00 AM- 5:00 PM.
